

What is social enterprise?



Using the power of the marketplace to solve the most pressing societal problems, social enterprises are commercially viable businesses existing to benefit the public and the community, rather than shareholders and owners.



A social enterprise has a defined social purpose



That social purpose is at the heart of everything that social enterprise does



Why social enterprise?



Government:

Somewhat stable funding, Power and influence Community perception, Lack of flexibility, time and change



Corporate:

Financial security, Structure and process Motivation, Compromise outcomes for profit



Not for Profit / Charity:
Reputation, Mission focussed
Unstable funding, Process poor.
Relies on volunteering



Sustainability:

Maximising resources using mixed funding approaches






Visibility: Bringing whole of community into suicide and mental health spaces

Case Study:

Outcomes for suicide prevention project



Phase 1:

In the week following the workshops:

- -19 participants (68%) used safeTALK to ask someone if they were thinking about suicide
- -19 participants had 72 conversations about suicide with peers

In the 4 weeks after the workshops:

-Participants indicated that they had collectively had 146 individual conversations

EMHS

-65 ASIST interventions with people who were thinking about suicide


Social Enterprise Approach – Capacity Building Outcomes

The capacity building outcomes generated by the project delivery were projected to deliver over \$41,200 of value (value, venue and service donations) to the community group
